

WORDS FROM THE GENERAL SUPERVISOR


Dear Friends,

We thank God for His faithfulness, goodness, and mercy, which we have seen in our daily journey at the Nehemiah Center in 2024.

We saw 2,648 people involved, including pastors and leaders, who directly benefited from the programs and initiatives that the Nehemiah Center carries out. This was achieved through 78 churches that directly participated in the Nehemiah Center's initiatives, through the implementation of projects under the Holistic Mission and Church Strengthening programs.

Holistic Mission is developing the Peaceful Coexistence Project (Trauma Healing, Peaceful Fellowship and Violence Prevention, Restorative Practices) and Self-Savings and Micro Loans in the city of León. Another part of Integral Mission is carried

out through the Churches with Christian Schools project, which is being implemented with participants from several cities across the country.



We have seen God working in the Nicaraguan church through the process of spiritual formation and ministerial equipping as a part of these programs. Pastors have expressed a positive impact on their own lives, as well as their church congregation and community.

We are deeply grateful to all our partner churches and ministries that have trusted us by providing their financial contributions for the implementation of projects in Nicaragua.

We trust that God will continue to open doors to continue collaborating with the local church in the expansion of God's kingdom.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS CONT'D

More than 400 participants received training in church strengthening in 2024.

38 pastors and church leaders are expanding their biblical worldview in terms of caring for people with disabilities.

pastors and leaders learned about Addiction and how the church can help people recover from addiction in a pastoral conference.

81 church leaders strengthened their ability in the area of emotional trauma and 34 participants were indirectly impacted.

55 participants received training on "Transformative Teaching" and "Caring for the Caring" to improve their teaching in their classrooms.

churches with a total of 45 leaders received follow-up training to strengthen their Clinics for the Soul for the benefit of their churches and communities.




Youth Discipleship
